

IVEL MAC -- 2024 ELECTRIC GLIDER LEAGUE COMPETITION

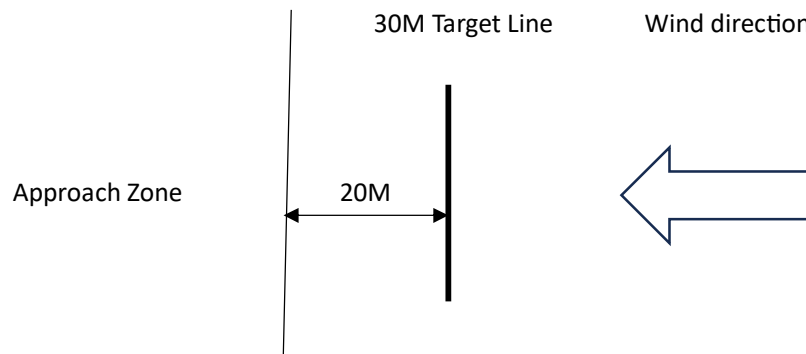
A league competition for electric powered gliders is planned for 2024.
The winner will get a Cup to polish for a year, as well as a small trophy to keep.

The competition will be run as a league event, held over a number of **Sessions** during 2024.
There is no requirement for each contestant to attend every **Session**.
Each contestant may take part in as many **Sessions** during the season as desired. However, each contestant may only participate in one **Flight** per **Session**.

We plan to run a minimum of **6 Sessions** which may be held at: weekends, weekdays, or club flying evenings. Starting after Easter until end September each **Session** will be notified beforehand to club members, quite possibly at short notice. At the end of the season, the best **3 Flight** results for each contestant will count towards deciding the trophy winner.

The idea is that up to 6 models at once can fly at once using the same air (but not the same airspace hopefully) and without any other models airborne. The minimum number of contestants flying together to count towards the league result is 4.

1. A 30M line will be placed crosswind which will be the landing target to aim for at the end of the flight.
2. The models are to be launched simultaneously with a fixed length motor run decided by the session director, 10 secs would be the usual time.
3. On final approach, models must approach from at least 20M downwind of the target line. The reason for a target line, rather than a spot is to try to avoid the chance of collision damage.



Scoring:

1. Points are awarded **only to the 2 competitors with the longest flight time.**
2. To score at all, the model must land on the mown grass, and must approach from further downwind than 20M from the target line. Failure of either condition = zero points, other contestants cannot move up.
3. A landing point will be given **only to the closer of the 2 competitors with the longest flights.** After the model has come to rest, the closest point of the models to the line to be compared.
4. Scoring:

2 points	For the last to land.
1 point	For 2 nd last to land.
1 point	For closest to the target line.

In the event of a tie at the end of the season, there will be a fly-off to decide the winner.
For a Fly-off, there will not be any landing points awarded, so the last to land on the mown area wins.
